Workshop Overview

DAY 1

Principles of violence risk assessment and management

- The nature of violence and violence risk
- Principles of violence risk assessment, focusing on structured professional judgment (SPJ) approaches
- Principles of violence risk management, focusing on scenario planning approaches
- The unique environment of post-secondary institutions

DAY 2

Assessing and managing risk for general violence

- Focuses on general or “typical” violence, including that committed by people with mental health, personality, or substance use problems
- Includes administration of the Historical-Clinical-Risk-Management-20 (HCR-20^{V3})

DAY 3

Assessing and managing risk for intimate partner violence

- Focuses on violence against current or former intimate partners, one of the most common and dangerous forms of violence
- Includes administration of the Spousal Assault Risk Assessment Guide (SARA^{V3}) and the Brief Spousal Assault Form for the Evaluation of Risk (B-SAFER)

DAY 4

Assessing and managing risk for stalking

- Focuses on unwanted contact and communication, including physical violence, by people who are angry or obsessed
- Includes administration of the Guidelines for Stalking Assessment and Management (SAM)

DAY 5

Implementation of violence risk assessment and management procedures

- Focuses on constraints due to institutional policies, procedures, and operational requirements
- Includes discussion of
 - Triaging for violence risk to determine when comprehensive assessment is necessary
 - Legal issues (e.g., human rights, privacy and information sharing, occupational health and safety)
 - Documentation (e.g., purpose, format, and content of written reports)
 - Establishment and operation of threat assessment or behavioural intervention teams (e.g., training, liaison with external agencies)

Daily Schedule

The workshop runs from 0900 to 1630 each day, with refreshment breaks in the morning and afternoon and a lunch break from 1200 to 1300. Lunch and refreshments will be provided.

Registration is from 0830 to 0900 on the first day of the workshop.
