- Review case #2 and administer the HCR-20^{V3}
- Write long report based on case #2

DAY 4

Communicating oral reports and conducting expert testimony

- Discuss core components of risk communication
- Practice oral report based on case #2
- Discuss general principles for conducting expert testimony
- Practice expert testimony based on case #2

DAY 5

Implementation of violence risk assessment and management procedures

- Discuss constraints due to institutional policies, procedures, and operational requirements
- Discuss:
 - Triaging for violence risk to determine when comprehensive assessment is necessary
 - Legal issues (e.g., human rights, privacy and information sharing, occupational health and safety)
 - Implementation of violence risk assessment tools (e.g., multiple tools, parallel investigations)
 - Establishment and operation of threat assessment teams (e.g., training, liaison with external agencies)

Daily Schedule

The workshop runs from 0900 to 1630 each day, with refreshment breaks in the morning and afternoon and a lunch break from 1200 to 1300.

Registration is from 0830 to 0900 on the first day of the workshop.

Certificate of Competence

Participants will be provided with individualized evaluation related to these skills and successful completion will be recognized with a certificate of competency.
