HCR-20 Version 3 Train-the-Trainer Certification Programme

ProActive ReSolutions is pleased to announce its certification programme for training on the HCR-20 Version 3 Violence Risk Assessment Instrument. The first two Workshops will occur in London, UK between September 27-29, 2016 and York, UK between March 7-9, 2017.

For ethical, legal, and clinical reasons, it is very risky for professionals to provide training in the use of a specific risk assessment tool - or for others to take training provided by them - unless the professionals have demonstrated competence in both the use of the tool and the training of others to use the tool. For this reason, we have developed an official "Train-the-Trainer" programme that will allow us to certify others to deliver approved HCR-20 V3 training.

This programme will allow us to endorse other trainers for the first time by directly evaluating their knowledge of general principles of violence risk assessment, their familiarity with the professional and scientific literature concerning the HCR-20, their skills in the use of the HCR-20 V3, their skills with respect to training professionals, and the accuracy of the training materials they use.

The HCR-20 V3 is a structured and evidence based procedure for assessing and managing violence risk. Released in 2013, research evaluations indicate it possesses the same robust characteristics of its predecessor, which in 2014 was found to be the most commonly used violence risk assessment tool world-wide (Singh et al., 2014).

Thousands of professionals from hundreds of settings across the world have taken part in our Workshops to date and the procedures developed by our Threat Assessment Specialists are among the most widely used in the field. Our Violence Risk Assessment and Management Workshops are the only ones in this field that have been subjected to peer-review, and systematic empirical research. Evaluations indicate that the vast majority of participants recommend our Workshops.

Drs. Douglas and Hart have been involved in the development of the Structured Professional Judgment (SPJ) model of violence risk assessment and management for more than two decades. They are the lead authors of the HCR-20 Version 3 Violence Risk Assessment Instrument. Both instructors also work as Threat Assessment Specialists at ProActive ReSolutions Inc., where Dr. Hart heads ProActive's Threat Assessment Stream. Both hold Ph.D. degrees in clinical-forensic psychology, and Dr. Douglas also holds a law degree. Combined, they have appointments at Simon Fraser University, University of Bergen, Mid-Sweden University, and the University of Oslo.

They have played key roles in national and international organizations, including the Canadian Association of Threat Assessment Professionals, American Psychology-Law Society, the American Psychological Association, and the International Association of Forensic Mental Health Services.

On behalf of threat assessment professional associations in the United States, Canada, Europe and Asia Pacific, they disseminate the Intelligence newsletter that provides recent advances in research, practice, and the law related to threat assessment around the globe. They also maintain the HCR-20 Annotated Bibliography, a summary of all HCR-20 research conducted around the globe.

Their work focuses on developing, evaluating and implementing strategies related to preventing, assessing, and managing violence.

The instructors have received numerous awards for their work in this area and combined have (co-) authored more than 900 articles, chapters, books, manuals, and presentations, and conducted more than 500 workshops around the world.
